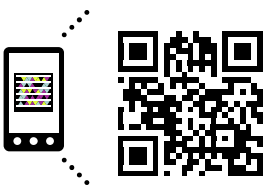

Huttleston Marketplace opens this Saturday

Press Release

There will be arts and crafts, including pottery, woodworking, jewelry, knitted goods, photo note cards, original artwork and prints. There will be hand woven items, t-shirts, and upcycled and repurposed household decor. There will be farm fresh produce, local eggs, honey, three bakeries, and some great food. There will be antiques and collectibles. There will be yarn, wreaths, walking sticks, soaps, balms, candles. There will be live music in the early afternoon.

Close to 50 booths will be set up when the second season of Fairhaven's outdoor Huttleston Marketplace opens on Saturday, June 1, at 10:00 a.m. The marketplace is held on the lawn of the Fairhaven Visitors Center, 141 Main Street, at the intersection of Route 6, directly next door to Fairhaven High School. The hours are 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and there's free parking in the high school lots. It will continue to operate, rain or shine, every Saturday through September 1, except for June 29.

"Last year we started a vibrant outdoor shopping spot — part arts, crafts, and collectibles fair, part farmers market — that happens weekly through the summer months," says Fairhaven tourism director Chris Richard, who organizes the market. "Besides being a great place to shop, it provided a venue for crafters, artists, and other compatible merchants to set up shop, so to speak."

Word of the marketplace had spread among vendors from southeastern Massachusetts and Rhode Island. Overall there are more than 80 vendors signed up to be here during the 2019 season, but not all of them will be at the market every week. The vendors will vary, so there are lots of reasons to stop by every Saturday.

On opening day, food vendors will include JA Patty with homemade Jamaican patties (meat, jerk chicken, veggie curry) served with sauce, hibiscus iced tea, Jamaican soda and snacks; the Fairhaven Lions Club booth with malasadas, linguica sandwiches, coffee and infused water; Mooseman's Kettle Corn; and lots of

fresh baked goods from Cyd's Creative Kitchen, Captivating Twists, and Brenda's Pastries and Cakes. The musical duo TRUUE will perform from noon to 2:00 p.m.

"The public coming here each week will see select, unique things for sale. There will not be any new mass-manufactured goods, multi-level marketing products, or garage and rummage sale items," says Mr. Richard. "Shoppers will be supporting creative artisans from our own region."



Board of Health offers sunscreen and smoking cessation info

The Town of Fairhaven Board of Health has collaborated with IMPACT Melanoma and the National Council on Skin Cancer Prevention to practice safe skin. In response to sun safety awareness, the Fairhaven Employee Wellness Committee has also jumped onboard, as they have partnered with the Fairhaven Health Department to obtain dispensers for public use, taking the active pledge of practicing safe skin.

Melanoma is rising faster than any other cancer with one person every 50 minutes dying from the disease. Studies show that with daily sunscreen protection, the risk of melanoma is preventable. As part of the Practice Safe Skin program, these specially designed dispensers offer sunscreen as an effective preventive measure to help avoid sun over-exposure year round. Each sunscreen dispenser is equipped with four 1,000 mL pouches of hypoallergenic broad-spectrum

SPF 30 sunscreen, which is safe for people aged six months and older.

Be on the lookout for a dispenser at any of these locations: Fort Phoenix, Pope Beach, Seaview Avenue, Causeway Road, West Island Town Beach, Pease Boat Ramp, Livesey Park, Cushman Park, Macomber Pimental Field, the start and end points of the Fairhaven Bike Path, Fairhaven Recreation Center and the Fairhaven Department of Public Works building located at 5 Arsene Street.

Quit smoking now

The Town of Fairhaven Board of Health would like all residents, parents, teenagers and school professionals to be aware of the dangers of smoking and vaping usage. The Massachusetts Department of Public Health offers resources and information to support those who are trying to quit smoking, as well as information to support parents and school professionals when the time comes to teach teenagers about tobacco products.

If you're thinking about quitting, your health insurance plan can help. Through the Affordable Care Act, many public and private plans are required to cover all seven FDA-approved quit-smoking medications. Call the customer service number on the back of your health insurance member card to find out what your benefits are. If you don't have health insurance, you can still sign up for the new affordable health plans being offered. You can also enroll online to receive four weeks of free nicotine patches by visiting www.makesmokinghistory.org/quit-now/

E-cigarettes recently surpassed conventional cigarettes as the most commonly used tobacco product among youth. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, e-cigarettes are not safe for youth, young adults, pregnant women or adults who do not currently use tobacco products. E-cigarettes have not been approved by the Food and Drug Administration as a smoking cessation device.

The Friends of the Millicent Library held their annual meeting on Monday, May 20. The meeting began with a moment of silence for a teenaged migrant who died that afternoon in ICE custody, as well as all those coming to America since the seventeenth century who did not survive their journeys.

Nearly fifty people heard Lisa Maya Knauer, professor of sociology and anthropology at the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth, speak about immigration from Guatemala. She described the violence and poverty that have led people to leave their country, the reasons they have come to the South Coast, and the opportunities and problems they face once they are here.

Professor Knauer has lived in Guatemala and has worked with New Bedford's immigrant community for more than a decade.♦♦♦

"Immuno-Oncology: Is our immune system the cure for our cancer?" New Bedford Science Café is pleased to announce that our next guest will be immunologist Hadley Witt, a PhD candidate in Pathobiology at Brown University and research scientist in the Dept of Surgery at Rhode Island Hospital.

Cancer has continued to vex healthcare professionals and research scientists. How do you systematically kill off a relatively miniscule part of a patient without killing all of them? Traditional treatments for cancer have been historically limited to the shotgun approaches of chemotherapy and surgical removal. 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
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Fairhaven holds annual Memorial Day parade

Fairhaven held its annual Memorial Day activities, with a parade along Main Street, the raising of the big flag at Fairhaven High School, and services at Riverside Cemetery on Monday, 5/27/19, making it 151 years, since the very first "Decoration Day" on 5/30/1968, that the town has held a parade.

This year's event featured remarks by Emcee George Brownell; opening and closing prayers by the Rev. Bette McClure, First Congregational Church; the reading of General Logan's Orders, which created the day to honor military service members, by Selectboard Chairperson Charles K. Murphy, Sr.; Lincoln's Gettysburg

address by Fairhaven High School senior class president Noah Barton; remarks by Fairhaven Veterans Service Officer Bradford Fish; the reading of the honor rolls for the Town of Fairhaven, American Legion Post 166 and Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 2892; musical selections by the First Congregational Community Chorus; the laying of the wreaths at the Civil War veterans monument; musket fire salute by the Fairhaven Village Militia; and the sounding of Taps by Aubrey Stalter of the FHS band.

This year marks the 75th anniversary of D-Day in World War II, when more than 160,000 Allied troops landed on the French coastline to gain a foot-hold in Continental Europe against Nazi Germany.

Encampment shows life in 1700s

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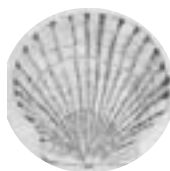
