Acushnet's 9-11 memorial is at the Fire Station, 24 Russell St., at Parting Ways near town hall. The memorial features a six-foot steel beam recovered from the World Trade Center site, a piece of the Pentagon building damaged in the attacks, and a stone from the field in Pennsylvania in which Flight 93 crashed.

The public is invited to visit the memorial any time of day or night. It was dedicated on 9/11/11.

#### Region is in "cone of uncertainty" for Hurricane Lee

Hurricane Lee still can't go which way to go. As of press time, the massive storm is still not quite headed in this direction, but we are not out of danger, either.

It has been as powerful as a category 5, has been downgraded and then upgraded more than once.

It is a large storm, so even if it tracks west, which is looking more likely as time goes on, this area will still get some residual effects from it.

At the very least, the south-facing shores will have swells and waves.

Tropical storm-force winds could extend over 300 miles from Lee's center.

The storm's impact could hit this area on Friday night. Depending on how much it turns east, that could mean big winds, lots of rain, and dangerous rip currents.

At the very least, big waves are predicted for this area. The track of the storm should be better defined around Wednesday afternoon when it turns north.

#### **Hurricane Checklist**

Prepare ahead of time before a hurricane hits. The weather service and local meteorologists will most likely give you a few days notice as storms form in the tropics and make their way up the coast, as is the case with Hurricane Lee right now.

Here is a check list from the American Red Cross on how to prepare for a hurricane. Visit www. redcross.org/prepare.

#### What to do: Before Make Plans to Stay Safe

Determine your best protection from high winds and flooding. Have a plan to evacuate and a plan to shelter safely.

If advised to evacuate, do so immediately

- You may have to leave your home quickly and go to a safe place.
- Know where you will go, how you will get there and where you will stay.
- · Plan well in advance if you will need help leaving or use public transportation.
- Mobile, manufactured, trailer homes and recreational vehicles (RVs) are not safe in high wind events. Plan ahead by preparing to

evacuate to a safe location. Plan to shelter safely

- Be ready to live without power, water, gas, phone and internet for a long time. Plan for your electrical needs, including cell phones and medical equipment. Talk to your doctor. Plan for backup power.
- Practice going to a designated safe shelter for high winds. The next best protection is a small room with no windows on the lowest level of a sturdy building that is not likely to flood.
- Be aware that flooding can happen quickly. Have a plan to evacuate fast before floodwaters reach you.
- Create a personal support team of people you may assist and who can assist you.

- Plan to monitor local weather and
- Have a backup battery or a way to charge your cell phone.
- Have a battery-powered radio during a power outage.
- Understand the types of alerts that you may receive and have a plan to respond when you receive them.
  - A WATCH means Be Prepared! - A WARNING means Take Action!
- - Alerts you may receive include:
- Hurricane Watch & Warning, Tropical Storm Watch & Warning, Extreme Wind Warning, Storm Surge Watch & Warning, Flash Flood Watch & Warning, Flood Watch & Warning.

Gather emergency supplies

Gather food, water and medicine. Stores and pharmacies might be closed. Organize supplies into a Go-Kit and a Stay-at-Home Kit.

- Go-Kit: at least three days of supplies that you can carry with you. Include backup batteries and chargers for your devices
- Stay-at-Home Kit: at least two

#### Old Stone Schoolhouse

After a brief hiatus, The Old Stone Schoolhouse, located at 40 North Street in Fairhaven, MA, will reopen to the public on select Saturdays through the rest of 2023. Opening hours will be 10:00 am to 1:00 pm on the following dates: September 16th, and 30th; October 21st, November 4th & 18th, and December 2nd, 2023.

"We are extremely pleased to be able to once again open The Old Stone Schoolhouse to the public," said Michael Kelly, a member of the Fairhaven Historical Commission. "This is a hidden gem that made a remarkable contribution to the history of the region, and we look forward to welcoming visitors from near and far."

The Old Stone Schoolhouse is a one-room schoolhouse built in 1828 at a cost of \$520.01, and served as the first public School in Fairhaven, operating until 1896 when the nearby, and much larger, Oxford School opened.

Manjiro Nakahama, a fourteenyear-old Japanese boy who was rescued by a New Bedford whaleship after being shipwrecked on a small island in the Pacific Ocean, attended classes at the Old Stone Schoolhouse. Upon returning to Japan many years later, Manjiro Nakahama would play a role in the negotiations between Commodore Matthew Perry and the Empire of Japan.

#### **Author Event**

In commemoration of International Underground Railroad Month in September, The New Bedford Historical Society is holding a reading with author Ilyon Woo author of *Master Slave Husband Wife* on Monday, 9/18 at 6:30 at Gallery X., 169 William St., New Bedford.

Master Slave Husband Wife is the remarkable true story of Ellen and William Craft, who escaped slavery through daring, determination, and disguise, with Ellen passing as a wealthy, disabled White man and William posing as "his" slave. The Crafts followed the Underground Railroad to freedom.

In 1848, a young, enslaved couple, Ellen and William Craft, achieved one of the boldest feats of self-emancipation in American history. Posing as master and slave, while sustained by their love as husband and wife, they made their escape together across more than 1,000 miles, riding out in the open on steamboats, carriages, and trains that took them from bondage in Georgia to the free states of the North.

Along the way, they dodged slave traders, military officers, and even friends of their enslavers, who might have revealed their true identities. The tale of their adventure soon made them celebrities, and generated headlines around the country. Americans could not get enough of this charismatic young couple, who traveled another 1,000 miles crisscrossing New England, drawing thunderous applause as they spoke alongside some of the greatest abolitionist luminaries of the day among them Frederick Douglass and William Wells Brown. The Crafts visited Nathan and Polly Johnson in New Bedford and their courage was celebrated by the New Bedford abolitionists.

But even then, they were not out of danger. With the passage of an infamous new Fugitive Slave Act in 1850, all Americans became accountable for returning refugees like the Crafts to slavery. Then yet another adventure began, as slave hunters came up from Georgia, forcing the Crafts to flee once again—this time from the United States, their lives and thousands more on the line and the stakes never higher.

#### Recipe of the Week

#### Fresh Rhubarb Pie

1 1/3 cups white sugar

6 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1 double-crust pie pastry

4 cups chopped rhubarb

1 tablespoon butter

Preheat oven to 450°. Place an oven rack in the lowest position.

Line the bottom and sides of a 9-inch pie plate with one pie crust. Combine sugar and flour in a bowl; sprinkle 1/4 of the sugar mixture over the prepared bottom crust.

Heap rhubarb on top and sprinkle with remaining sugar mixture. Dot with butter and cover with top crust.

Bake pie in the preheated oven for 15 minutes. Reduce temperature to 350° and continue baking until filling is bubbly and crust is golden brown, 40 to 45 minutes. Serve warm or cold.

#### Conrad Memorial Walk raises money for new law

The family of Conrad Roy III held the second annual Conrad's Law 5K Run/Walk on Saturday, 9/9/23, at Fort Phoenix in Fairhaven. The untimed walk/run raised money to support an effort to pass Conrad's Law, which would make it illegal to coerce suicide in Massachusetts.

Organizers said about 120 people registered to walk/run in the race,

plus volunteers and spectators.

"There were also a ton of younger kids, which was great to see," said Conrad's aunt, Kim Bozzi, who organized the event.

Mr. Roy, 18, was found on July 13, 2014, in his pickup truck with a spent gas-powered water pump in the back seat of the crew-cab. His friend Michelle Carter was found guilty of involuntary manslaughter in his death for constantly goading him via

text messages and phone calls to kill himself. The prosecution charged that she did it for attention and sympathy for herself.

Conrad's Law, Bill S.2382, would set a maximum sentences of five years in prison for coercing suicide.





- Have a one-month supply of medication in a child-proof container and medical supplies or equipment.
- Keep personal, financial and medical records safe and easy to access (hard copies or securely backed up). Consider keeping a list of your medications and dosages on a small card to carry with you.

Protect Your Home/Wind

- Secure or bring inside outdoor items, such as lawn furniture and trash cans, that could be picked up by high winds and hurt someone.
- Anchor objects that would be unsafe to bring inside, such as gas grills and propane tanks.
- Trim or remove trees close enough to fall on your home.
- Protect windows with permanent storm shutters or sheeting.

Protect Your Home/Flood

- Clean out drains, gutters and downspouts.
- Stockpile protective materials such as plastic sheeting and sandbags.
- Consider installing a sump pump with battery backup.
- Consider elevating the heating system, water heater and electric panel.
- Review insurance policies with your agency.

#### What to do: During

If local authorities advise you to evacuate, go right away.

- Bring your Go-Kit.
- Follow evacuation routes and do

not try to take shortcuts because they may be blocked.

 Check with local officials for shelter locations. Download the Red Cross Emergency App to find shelters near you.

Determine your best protection for high winds and flooding.

- Take shelter in a designated storm shelter or an interior room for high winds.
- Stay away from glass windows and doors.
- Move to higher ground before flooding begins.
- Never walk, swim, or drive through floodwater. Remember, Turn Around! Don't Drown!

#### What to do: After

Stay Safe

- Wait for officials to say it is safe before going back home.
- Avoid damaged or fallen power lines, poles and downed wires. They can electrocute you.
- Do not touch floodwaters because they may contain sewage, bacteria and chemicals that can make you ill
- If power is out, use flashlights or battery-powered lanterns to reduce fire risk.
- Be aware of carbon monoxide poisoning. Gasoline, propane, natural gas or charcoal-burning devices should never be used inside a home, basement, garage, tent or camper, or even outside near an open window. Carbon

monoxide can't be seen or smelled, but it can kill you fast. If you start to feel sick, dizzy or weak, get to fresh air right away, do not delay.

Stay Healthy

- When in doubt, throw it out! Throw out food that got wet or warm.
- Ask your healthcare provider about refrigerated medicines.
- Hurricanes and flooding can make drinking water unsafe. Monitor your local health department for information about drinking water safety.

Clean up Safely

- Wear appropriate protective equipment including gloves, goggles and boots
- Clean and disinfect everything that got wet.
- When cleaning heavy debris, work with a partner.
- Make sure that you have proper training before using equipment, such as chainsaws.
- Heart attacks are a leading cause of deaths after a hurricane. Be mindful of overworking.
- Cleaning up is a big job. Take breaks and take care of yourself.

Take Care of Yourself

- It's normal to have a lot of bad feelings, stress or anxiety.
- Eat healthy food and get enough sleep to help you deal with stress.
