# Standoff on West Island ends peacefully

Fairhaven police responded to 166 Ebony Street on West Island with seven cruisers, unmarked cars, and mutual aid vehicles on Monday, 9/2/24 at about 4:30 p.m.

The initial call reported that two people were on the floor and being assaulted.

When police arrived they discovered the suspect barricaded inside a camper armed with a knife. Police would not identify the man, citing the Domestic Violence Act of 2104. But *Neighb News* sources have confirmed he is Daniel Costa, 56, who has a long criminal history.

His mother, Jacqueline DeCosta, 75, lives with her husband Antonio Alfonso, 82, at that address. The couple was inside the home during the standoff which lasted until 8:15. They refused medical treatment from the ambulance that stood by during the incident.

Police turned off electricity to the property, used the drone to flash lights into the trailer, and used a bullhorn to try to get Mr. Costa to leave the trailer.

Two nearby homes were evacuated so police could maintain a safe perimeter around the property. Both Ebony and Dogwood Streets were blocked off. About 30 neighbors stood around the perimeter watching, along with news crews from several local TV stations.

After about 4 hours, at 8:15 p.m., he surrendered to police.

Police have been called to the property several times a month, and sometimes several times a week during the past year, due to Mr. Costa's behavior.

Neighbors say he routinely threatens people and their pets who walk by and swears at the neighbors when they are in their yards.

On August 6, police took him into custody after he allegedly tried to break into a nearby home with a hammer, while a woman and her two young children were inside.

In a press release, police said he suffered a "mental health emergency." (See 8/8/24 issue)

### **Election Results**


John Deaton will be the Republican to face incumbent Democrat Elizabeth Warren for senator in the general election on 11/3. Mr. Deaton and two other Republicans, Robert Antonellis and Ian Cain, faced off in the primary election on Tuesday, 9/3, with Mr. Deaton coming out on top according to the Associated Press.\*

Unofficial results from Fairhaven show the same result with Mr. Deaton receiving 664 votes; Robert Antonellis with 151; Ian Cain with 44. In Acushnet,\* Mr. Deaton received 398 votes; Mr. Antonellis 117; and Mr. Cain, 41.

Incmbent State Sen. Mark Montigny (D), Second Bristol & Plymouth, beat his rival, Molly Kivi, 1286–305 in Fairhaven, and 537–123 in Acushnet. District wide, the race had not been called by press time, but Sen. Montigny was leading 7,248 to 1,805 with 84% of votes counted, according to the Boston Globe. He has no Republican challenger.

In the 10th Bristol district, Mark Sylvia of Fairhaven ran unopposed on the Democratic side. On the Republican side, Joe Pires came out on top with 519 votes; Robert McConnell of Fairhaven got 365 votes.

### **Wood School Students collect for homeless**

Press Release

Second grade students from the Leroy Wood School in Fairhaven donated \$300 to help the homeless in their community. Under the leadership of teachers Amy Ingemi, Carol Tynan, Tess Tieu, and Paula Desrosiers, the second graders earned the money by running a school store for one week this past school year.

The students would set up and break down the store every day. They had to learn how to count money and promote their store. They worked different shifts and also learned about providing customer service, basic accounting, and basic economics including how to price products. The students at the school would come to the second graders' store and purchase Smencils, water bottle stickers, and home-made bracelets.

In the lead up to the store's opening, the students spent weeks making a variety of bracelets to market and sell. Once everything was sold, the class took everything to the next level by donating the proceeds

to local charities. Mrs. Ingemi said, "the highlight of the project was choosing a local charity to donate the profits to, instilling a sense of social responsibility and community service in the students."

One of the recipients of the donations was Works 4 U, Inc., a local non-profit with the ending mission of homelessness through employment. Works 4 U used the funds to purchase backpacks numerous camping items to fill them with: insect repellent, sunscreen, antiseptic gel, band aids, wet wipes, and a flashlight that doubles as a tent lantern. The are individuals who experiencing homelessness in

the local community and who attend a weekly work project to help improve the look of the downtown New Bedford by picking up litter every Saturday morning.



## Recipe of the Week

#### **Butter Chicken**

- 1 tablespoon oil
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 medium onion diced
- 1 tsp fresh ginger finely minced or grated (or use paste)
- 2-3 cloves garlic, minced or crushed
- 1 1/2 lbs about 2-3 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cut into 3/4" chunks
- 4 tablespoons tomato paste or 8 oz can of tomato sauce
- 1 tablespoon garam masala
- 1 tsp chili powder or paprika, adjust to taste
- 1 teaspoon mustard seeds
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp black pepper
- 1 cup heavy cream

Fresh cilantro, for garnish

Add oil and butter to a large skillet over med-high heat. Once the butter has melted, add the onion and cook until golden. Add the ginger and garlic. Cook for about 30 seconds until fragrant (don't let it burn).

Add chicken, tomato paste, and all spices. Cook for 6-7 minutes, stirring frequently until cooked through.

Add the cream and allow contents to simmer for 8-10 minutes, stirring occasionally. Garnish with fresh cilantro and serve over rice.

# OLOA Feast has successful weekend, despite early shutdown

The 94th annual Our Lady of Angels Portuguese feast in Fairhaven had huge crowds despite rain and some violence outside the feast grounds. On Saturday night, the first night of the feast, a bit of a scuffle broke out in the parking lot between two young women, reportedly over a relationship issue.

On Sunday, though, the situation was more serious, with a drive-by shooting on Main Street, outside the feast grounds. Police immediately shut down the feast, and sent everyone home around 10 p.m.

According to a Fairhaven police press release and *Neighb News* sources, the victim was a 19-year-old man who suffered non life threatening injuries. He was transported to St. Luke's Hospital.

Three people were detained in connection to the shooting, but it is unclear if the shooter was one of them or if anyone was charged.

Denise Paulson and Kevin McAllister were there when the commotion took place, and they were back on Monday. They returned, they said, to "give a little support."

The shutdown was announced, they said and people were asked to leave but asked not to rush out.

"They did a very good job of getting everybody out of here

quickly," said Mr. McAllister.

"I was impressed," said Ms. Paulson, adding no one panicked.

After they slipped out the side entrance, they saw police from towns all around, they said, and made their way to the parking lot.

"Everybody was helping everybody out in the parking lot," said Mr. McAllister. "It was very well handled."

Meanwhile,

OLOA club members said that the first night was so busy they made 50% of what they made last year during the whole feast. Saturday's rain did

not stop people from attending. The malasadas line was as long as always. At night, the dance floor was filled. Food and beverage sales were strong

according to club members.

Charlie Murphy, a club member and Fairhaven elected official wrote

on his Facebook Page: "Everyone is safe, and unfortunately, a situation occurred that was beyond our control. All we want to do is provide a family friendly great cultural experience, great food, and great fun! All of our families are involved in each day

He also said he hoped the procession on Monday would be well attended, and it absolutely was.

Matthew Leblanc was showing his "Rat Rod," a vehicle that started out as a 1937 GMC pickup truck, and has been customized into something unique.



In the 8th, Democrat Steven Ouellette of Westport was unopposed. He has no Republican opponent in the general election. District-wide results were not available by press time.

In other races, incumbent US Rep. Bill Keating (D) ran unopposed and will face off against Republican challenger Dan Sullivan.

Turnout was 14.36% in Acushnet, and approximately 16.75% in Fairhaven.




