

## Oxford School Weathervane restored

The Livesey Club held a rededication event on 12/7/25 to show the restored weathervane that used to be on the cupola at the Oxford School. The weathervane now sits proudly atop the cupola of the Livesey Club building, 11 Hopkins Street, not far at all from the old school, which is now the Oxford School Residences.

"The Livesey Club took on the responsibility of restoring the

historic artifact of North Fairhaven which had been a landmark for more than a century," wrote David Darmofal in an email. "The Livesey Club now displays the weathervane proudly for all to enjoy."


He said the many individuals and business, along with students from New Bedford Regional Vocational Technical High School, worked to restore the weathervane.

# Recipe of the Week

## Holiday 7 Layers Bars

1/2 cup butter  
2 c vanilla wafers, finely crushed  
1 (14-ounce) can sweetened condensed milk  
1 c butterscotch-flavored pieces  
1 (6-ounce) package white baking chocolate, chopped  
1 cup dried fruit pieces  
1 1/3 cups shredded coconut  
1 cup unsalted mixed nuts, coarsely chopped  
Preheat the oven to 350°

Line a 9x13-inch baking pan with foil, with the foil extending over the edges of the pan. This will help with removing the bars from the pan later.

Place the butter in the prepared pan and then place the pan in the oven until the butter melts, for about 5 minutes.

Remove the pan from the oven, leaving the oven on, and then coat the bottom of the pan with the melted butter.

Sprinkle in the crushed vanilla wafers.

Drizzle the condensed milk as evenly as possible over the wafers.

Sprinkle the butterscotch-flavored pieces, white chocolate chunks, fruit bits, coconut, and nuts, in that order, one on top of the other in the pan. Make sure to press down the layers lightly as you add them.

Bake until the edges are lightly browned, for about 25 minutes.

Remove the pan and let cool on a wire rack.

Use the foil to lift the dessert out of the pan and cut it into bars.

Serve cool.

### HUD Proposal Will Increase Homelessness

The Massachusetts Housing & Shelter Alliance (MHS) submitted a declaration as part of a lawsuit filed on 12/2/25 by a coalition of nonprofit organizations and local governments against the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

HUD is rolling out a massive policy change to Continuum of Care (CoC) funding that will dramatically cut housing for people with disabilities nationwide. Nearly 4,000 households across Massachusetts are in danger of returning to homelessness.

This is not a budget cut by Congress; it is a reckless policy change by HUD to largely eliminate



## Ramps for the Holidays

Buzzards Bay Area Habitat for Humanity (BBAHFH) is seeking metal wheelchair ramp donations and support for their Ramp Donation Program.

Ramp recipients have ranged in age from teenagers to those in their nineties. In 2024, BBAHFH formally introduced the Ramp Donation program giving low-income homeowners the accessibility they need to remain safe in their homes. Through ramp donations and purchases, BBAHFH tries to maintain an inventory available that can be loaned out and installed by volunteers when needed by a family, but this can be difficult as ramps are expensive, and the need is great. BBAHFH is grateful for its partners, including the families who have donated ramps to be reused, supporting foundations in the region, and Oakley Home Access for making ramps available on a discounted basis.

When a family no longer requires the ramp, it is picked up by BBAHFH and then loaned to another low-income family in need. The Ramp Donation program helps those with existing accessibility issues, temporary injuries, or those who are checking out of a rehabilitation facility with hopes of returning home.

BBAHFH is running this program throughout Acushnet, Dartmouth, Fairhaven, Marion, Mattapoisett, New Bedford, Rochester, Wareham, and Westport, and ramps are installed at no cost for families. This project is funded in part by grants from the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection, and the Executive Office of Aging & Independence and Coastline Elderly

Services, the Area Agency on Aging, through Federal Title-III funds.

Claims of invalidity of any of the amendments to the bylaw by reason of any defect in the procedure of the adoption or replacement may only be made within ninety (90) days of this announcement.

### ARTICLE 13A: NEW REVOLVING FUND – ROGER A. GRIMSHAW PARK

By majority vote, the Town voted to authorize a "Roger A. Grimshaw Park Revolving Account" under the provisions of Massachusetts General Law Chapter 44, Section 53 E 1/2 by adding the following paragraphs to §2-6 of the Town Bylaws: Roger A. Grimshaw Park Revolving Fund

- (1) Roger A. Grimshaw Park Revolving Fund. There shall be a separate fund called the "Roger A. Grimshaw Park Revolving Fund" authorized for use by the Council on Aging Director.
- (2) Revenues. The Town Accountant shall establish the Roger A. Grimshaw Park Revolving Fund as a separate account and credit to the fund 15% of all fees received from events located at Roger A. Grimshaw Park received by the Council on Aging in connection with the use of and events held at Roger A. Grimshaw Park.
- (3) Purposes and expenditures. During each fiscal year, the Council on Aging Director may incur liabilities against and spend monies from the Roger A. Grimshaw Park Revolving Fund for the purpose of funding the upkeep, maintenance, and improvement of Roger A. Grimshaw Park, or act in any other manner related thereto.
- (4) Fiscal years. The Roger A. Grimshaw Park Revolving Fund shall operate for fiscal years that begin on or after July 1, 2025 and to see if the Town will vote to authorize a total amount that may be expended from the Roger A. Grimshaw Park Revolving Fund for Fiscal Year 2026.

### ARTICLE 13B: REVOLVING FUNDS

By majority vote, the Town voted to authorize or re-authorize the following Revolving Accounts under the provisions of Massachusetts General Law Chapter 44, Section 53 E 1/2 by adding the following and to amend General Bylaws Section 2-6 terms:

### ARTICLE 17: AMEND BYLAW, CHAPTER 164, SOLID WASTE

By majority vote, the Town voted to amend Bylaws, Chapter 164 Solid Waste by adding to the existing language indicated below in bold/underlined.

#### B. General Prohibition and Regulation.

No retail establishment, retail food establishment, nonprofit and/or Town facility food provider shall transfer merchandise to end consumers in a thin- film single-use plastic bag, and shall only use check- out bags that are:

a. Reusable checkout bags

**i. Reusable checkout bag shall be defined as the following: "A bag that is not made of plastic film and that is made from any other natural or synthetic fabric, including, but not limited to, woven or nonwoven nylon, polypropylene, polyethylene-terephthalate, or Tyvek, shall satisfy all of the following:**

- (1) It shall be sewn.**
- (2) It shall be capable of carrying 22 pounds over a distance of 175 feet for a minimum of 125 uses.**
- (3) It shall have a minimum fabric weight of at least 80 grams per square meter.**

### ARTICLE 18: AMEND BYLAW, CHAPTER 50, § 3, MEETING TO ELECT TOWN OFFICIALS

By majority vote, the Town voted to amend Bylaws, Chapter 50 § 3, Meeting to elect Town officials by striking some of the existing language as indicated in strikethrough, or adding language as indicated in bold/underlined below.

The Annual Town Meeting shall be held on the first Monday in April Saturday in May, unless otherwise specified by the Select Board, at which time all articles in the warrant will be considered, at which time the election of all Town officials and Town Meeting members shall take place, and thereafter said meeting will be adjourned to another day for the consideration of all other articles in the warrant. The Annual town election of officers and town meeting members will be adjourned until the 2nd Tuesday in June.

funding that currently keeps people housed, and replace it with short-term services.

The lawsuit challenges HUD's unlawful and unreasonable restrictions that seek to shift funding away from proven solutions to homelessness, threatening to push hundreds of thousands of people onto the street as cold winter months arrive.

The coalition behind the new legal challenge includes the National Alliance to End Homelessness (NAEH), the National Low Income Housing Coalition (NLIHC), Crossroads Rhode Island, Youth Pride, Inc., as well as the County of Santa Clara, Calif., San Francisco, Calif., King County, Wash., Boston, Mass., Cambridge, Mass., Nashville, Tenn., and Tucson, Ariz.

Democracy Forward represents the coalition of nonprofit organizations in the matter; the National Homelessness Law Center represents NAEH and NLIHC; Public Rights Project represents the cities of Boston, Cambridge, Nashville and Tucson; and Santa Clara County and San Francisco represent themselves. The Lawyers' Committee for Rhode Island, and the ACLU Foundation of RI represent all plaintiffs. MHSA's declaration focuses on the severe and irreparable harm that HUD's policy change will have on Massachusetts communities. As a statewide organization, we believe it is critical for MHSA to contribute to

The lawsuit follows last week's announcement that Massachusetts Attorney General Andrea Joy Campbell and a coalition of 20 other states also filed a lawsuit to challenge HUD's unlawful restrictions on the CoC program.

The stakes are high, and there is a lot of work ahead of us. But what gives me hope are the people coming together nationwide to stand up for what we know works: housing solutions to homelessness.
